



Everyone is invited to join us for dinner and Advent activities that will help prepare our hearts and minds for the coming of the Christ Child.


There will be activities for our entire EPC family, from our very youngest to our oldest. We will be creating items for you to take home as well as items to be used here at EPC and items to be shared with others.


