This fall, we will have a 12 week sermon series on Compassion. Compassion is an interesting word. It comes from the root words that combine to mean "suffer with." Miriam Webster defined compassion as a sympathetic consciousness of others' distress together with a desire to alleviate it." It is different from empathy, which focuses solely on the awareness of another's suffering. Compassion includes a desire to do something with that feeling. This fall, we will consider what to do with the empathy we feel and how to be truly compassionate toward others.

We began Sunday, September 3 with the theme of Courage. Future themes include Hospitality, Kindness and Peace. The children will be studying the same theme in the childcare and classroom using a curriculum entitled *Illustrated Compassion*. If your family is unable to stay for the Education Hour, please pick up a children's packet from the Commons Table to explore the scripture at home.

No matter where you are on the theological or political spectrum, it is clear our world needs more compassion. Turning to scripture, we will look at examples of God's compassion explore and ask what it means to live a Compassionate life in today's world.


