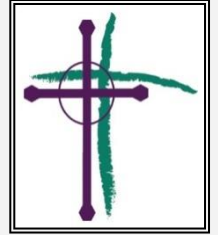

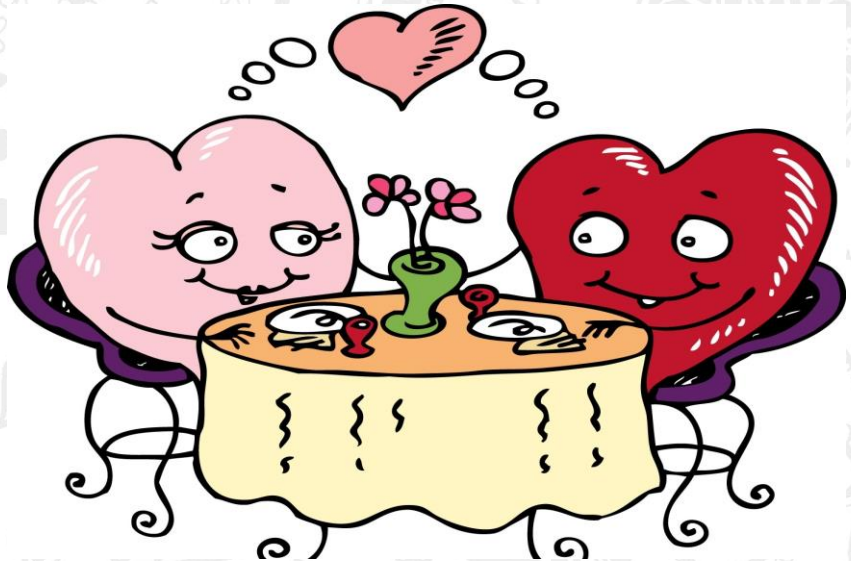

Pastor's Corner- A Note from Pressley

"We were glad to share not only God's good news with you but also our very lives because we cared for you so much" 1 Thessalonians 2:8

Dear Eastminster Friends and Family-

I am currently reading The Caring Congregation by Karen Lampe, executive pastor of congregational care at The United Methodist Church of the Resurrection in Leawood, Kansas. (Some of you have studied books from this congregation's Senior Pastor Adam Hamilton). The first paragraph sums up what it means to be a Caring Congregation:

"Life is messy and often painful. None of us can avoid the grief and loss that happens in our lives. What we do to help each other get through the difficult times can be complex, yet it can be so simple. As people of faith committed to healing and wholeness, sometimes we can just show up and reach out. Other times, we offer words of comfort or a listening ear."

I have always been amazed at how Eastminster functions as a family that cares for one another. When someone says, "I'm praying for you", they actually mean "You are in my daily prayer." "I'll send you a card later this week" means "I will call to check on you," or "I'll stop by and visit you." There aren't any insincere words spoken, but honest words followed by action.

As I continue to heal from having my tonsils and adenoids removed on Friday, Jan 23, it has been a privilege and a bit overwhelming to be on the receiving end of congregational care this past week. I cannot begin to express how grateful we are for the amount of love that has been shared with me and my family through the cards, emails, texts, calls, meals, car rides, and so much more.

Thank you, not only for caring for me, your pastor, but for providing for my family as I heal. And thank you for being a congregation that cares for one another, prays for one another, and loves one another.

May the God of our Lord Jesus Christ continue to work in and through you, growing each of you in grace, faith, and knowledge; so that together you may truly be the Body of Christ in the world, just as you have been the Body of Christ to me.

9:15-10:15 am



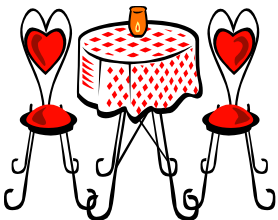

Worship Wednesday, Feb 18 6:30 pm

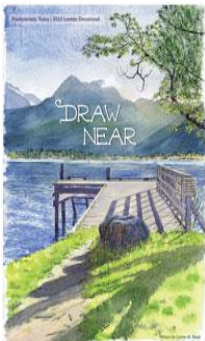
Why ashes? The Ashes used on Ash Wednesday come from burning the Palms used for Palm Sunday the previous year. In part the Ashes remind us that the world still is not what it could be, that the world is still--to use theological language--held captive by sin, that the Reign of God has not yet fully come. And so, as we embark on the journey that leads to betrayal and arrest, trial and conviction, hilltop cross and garden tomb, we pause to remember that we are flawed human beings living in a flawed system. Lent is usually seen as a season of reflection on the world and our place in it. Within that reflection is a time to name how we have missed the mark and how we might try better. An Ash cross on our forehead is a way to start that reflection.

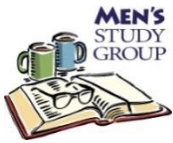

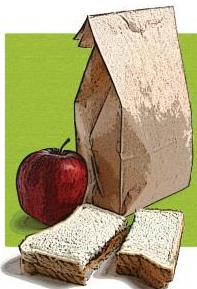

Read through the Bible in 2015

Join us in our 2015 EPC Bible reading plan. We will be posting readings in the monthly newsletter. If you follow the suggested daily reading, you will have read the WHOLE Bible by the end of 2015!

We recommend getting a journal or writing down observations from your reading. Consider using the **SOAP** method and finding a reading partner to keep you accountable.

SOAP method

Scripture – Read the passages of Scripture.

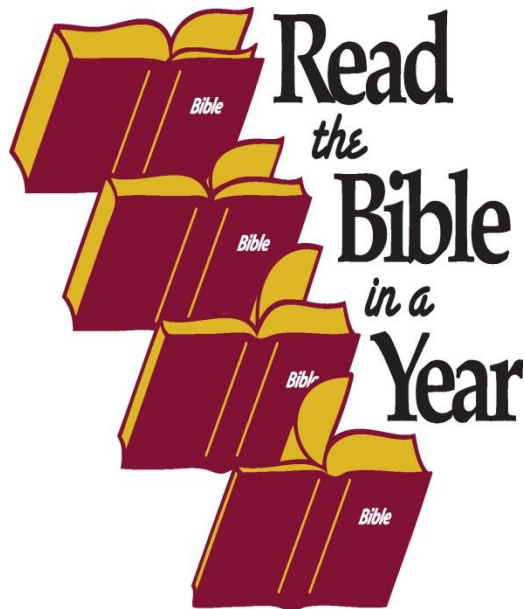
Observation – Write down what stands out to you.

Application – How does this apply to your life? What is God saying to you through this passage?

Prayer – Pray about what stood out to you from the Scripture and conclude your time by praying through the Lord's Prayer.

Reading Partner

Find a reading partner or group to read with that meets on a regular basis (weekly or bi-weekly) to share what you are learning. We find that those who have a partner are more likely to follow through. Blessings on your year of reading!

Maryville College Concert Choir

The Maryville College Concert Choir was organized in 1917 for the purpose of singing vesper services and was appropriately named the Vesper Choir. It became a part of the music curriculum in 1936 and underwent a name change to the "Maryville College Concert Choir" in 1954. Of the numerous fine directors, the one with the longest tenure is Dr. Harry H. Harter, who led the group from 1947 until his retirement in 1981. Most recently, Dr. Daniel Taddie served as choral director until leaving in the summer of 1999. Current director is Stacey Murphy Wilner, who is coordinator of choral music at Maryville College and currently serves as the Repertoire and Standards Chair for Colleges & Universities and past president for TN-ACDA. Today, members of the Concert Choir serve as musical ambassadors for the college. Participation is by audition only and many of the students are music scholarship recipients. In the spring of 2010, the Concert Choir began their residency in the Harry H. Harter Choral Rehearsal Room of the new Clayton Center for the Arts at Maryville College. Composed of Maryville College students, the Concert Choir is an auditioned ensemble that performs choral literature of many styles. The Concert Choir was selected to perform at the Tennessee State Music Educators Convention in Chattanooga in the spring of 2013.



Off Kilter

Off Kilter is a small auditioned ensemble comprised of upperclassmen from the Concert Choir. The attire worn by Off Kilter celebrates the Scottish heritage of Maryville College and includes kilts for the men, sashes for the ladies, both made of the official registered tartan. The ensemble performed at the Tennessee State Music Educators Convention in the spring of 2014.

Lads & Lassies

The Lads is a small ensemble of all men and the Lassies is comprised of all women. These two auditioned groups were formed in the fall of 2011 from student interest and initiative. The students serve as assistant directors the ensembles are available for community performances separately, as well as together. The fabric used in the bows worn by the lassies and bowties by the men, also incorporates the registered tartan for Maryville College.

Stacey Murphy Wilner, director of Concert Choir and Off Kilter, serves as coordinator of choral music at Maryville College. A graduate of Concord College and the University of Tennessee, Wilner has degrees in music education and choral conducting, and is a member of the American Choral Directors Association. In 2007, Wilner was the recipient of Maryville College's Administrator of the Year Award. She served as president of the TN-ACDA from 1997-99, and she is currently the Repertoire and Standards Chair for Colleges and Universities. She serves a Collegiate Chair for the East TN Vocal Association and is active as a guest conductor and clinician at festivals in the South.

Alan Eleazer, currently serves as the conductor for the Maryville College Community Chorus since 2008, having been a professional musician, conductor and college educator in East Tennessee for 30 years. Eleazer also serves on the voice faculty at Maryville College and is the director for the Lads. He has directed music programs of several large United Methodist Churches.

Ashley Abbott, Choral Assistant for the Concert Choir, rehearsal assistant for Off Kilter, also serves as the director for the Lassies. Abbott graduated from Maryville College in the fall of 2012 with a bachelor's degree in music education. She also serves as the Fine Arts Recruiter for the Maryville College Division of Fine Arts.
