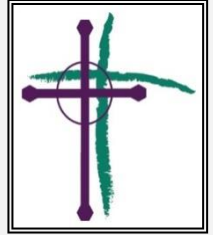

## Pastor's Corner- A Note from Pressley

Dear EPC family and friends-

As many of you remember, last fall we tried a "new" way of offering Children's Sunday School by placing it at the beginning of the worship hour rather than the traditional Sunday School hour before worship. This change has resulted in growing our average attendance for children from 5 or less to sometimes as many as 25! The children are receiving Christian education for 40 minutes before joining the congregation after the sermon as we respond to God's word through affirming our faith, presenting our tithes and offerings, and sharing in Communion. *This year, we will continue to offer Children's Sunday School at 10:30.*

Reflecting upon the positive change for children's education has led to numerous discussions on the overall Faith Formation program at Eastminster. What is that we do well and what can we do better? How can we provide the education for our youth?

During the August session meeting, our elders made a radical decision to take a five month intentional sabbatical from offering youth Sunday School during the traditional Sunday School hour. Instead our youth will have their education after church on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of the month. I am excited about this change and pleased to be a part of it by leading the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday each month!

While both these changes are exciting, one element that has been missing is an intergenerational education event that we will begin offering once a month. This will be a time of Feast, Faith and Fellowship (F<sup>3</sup>) for families. The vision of F<sup>3</sup> is to get people of all generations (preschool, elementary, youth, college, young adult, middle aged, older adults, etc.) to gather for an educational event once a month. Our first F<sup>3</sup> will be on Sunday, September 27 at 5:30-7:00 pm. I hope you will all join us as we grow in faith together!

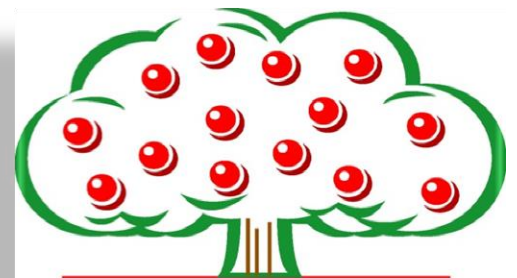

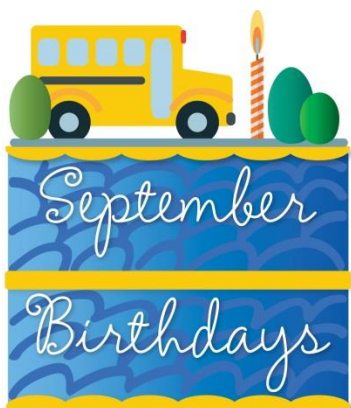

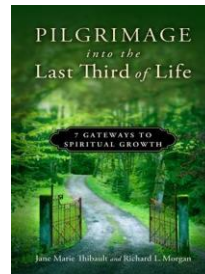


### Food For Thought

## ~ News from the Session ~

- ❖ Pastor Pressley Cox reported on the possibility of expanding EPC's role for Stephen Ministry. There will be a Stephen Ministry worship service, Saturday, September 12, 9 am-1 pm at First Presbyterian in Spartanburg. Six members from EPC will be attending.
- ❖ There will be a Greenville County Church Violence Conference, also on Saturday, September 12, 1-5 pm at Furman U. to discuss safety in the church.
- ❖ Our new EPC safety policy requires having two adults in the nursery to help Corky every Sunday. All elders are volunteering one Sunday during the fall. If our elders can keep the nursery, so can you!!
- ❖ Ann Coleman gave a report on the recent Foothills Presbytery called meeting. She spoke about how Foothills is a leader in the Presbyterian Church, USA for its commitments to writing overtures in church doctrine. There were eight overtures presented and all were accepted. Ann noted that there will be an increase of 0.7% in pensions for pastors.
- ❖ The following EPC members have volunteered to be part of the search committee for Luke's replacement: Melanie Armstrong, Gregg Campbell, Kim Gassner, Jim Parrish, Louis Steed, Carol Stewart and Linda Sucher.
- ❖ Pressley presented recommendations for changes in the youth Sunday school program. It was approved to take a sabbatical for youth Sunday school before church service (and continue having children leave for their Sunday School during service) until January in order to determine what other ways EPC can integrate youth spiritual needs within the context of the entire church service and community.
- ❖ Next Stated session meetings will be Sept. 20, Oct. 24, Nov. 15, Dec. 20 (Oct. 24 will be a Saturday Session Retreat and Session will provide breakfast for our GAIHN families). There will be a Session Retreat January 22-23 for the incoming elders.

### SOAP method

**Scripture** – Read the passages of Scripture.

**Observation** – Write down what stands out to you.

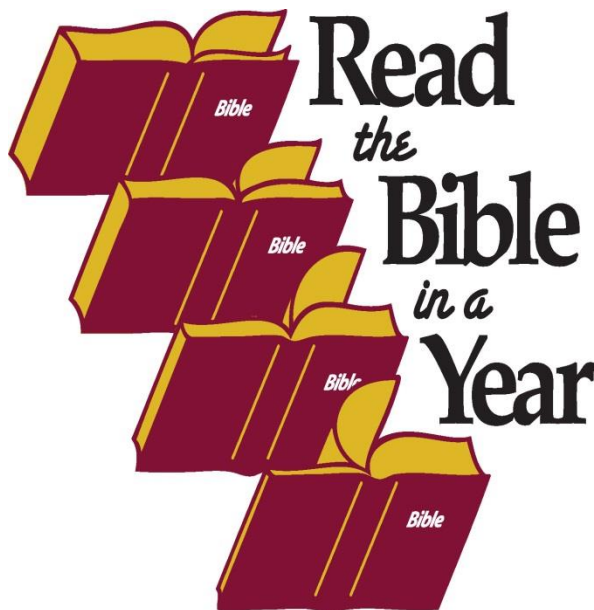
**Application** – How does this apply to your life?

What is God saying to you through this passage?

**Prayer** – Pray about what stood out to you from the Scripture and conclude your time by praying through the Lord's Prayer.

### Reading Partner

Find a reading partner or group to read with that meets on a regular basis (weekly or bi-weekly) to share what you are learning. We find that those who have a partner are more likely to follow through. Blessings on your year of reading!

### STEWARDSHIP

*“Each man should give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.” (2 Corinthians 9:7)*

What do you think of when you see that word? Many of us think immediately of money. We recall that time in our congregation’s life when we are asked to make a financial commitment for the coming year. At some level, however, we are aware that stewardship is more than money. Stewardship is how we live out our calling as followers of Christ. Stewardship is what we do after we say that we believe.

In our lives as stewards, the gifts we offer: time, talent and our tithe are holy gifts. They are symbols of love and signs of grace that are offered out of joy and devotion. These gifts are not dues to be paid or entrance fees to be offered. They are gifts of love. These gifts that we offer to God are symbols of our covenant of love with Jesus Christ, made in response to our understanding of Christ’s great love, which was offered first for us.

The tithe is an Old Testament idea. Prior to the coming of Christ, tithing was the law of the land requiring Israelites to give 10 percent of crops and livestock to the church or temple. Since the coming of Christ, we have moved away from tithing as law into a period of giving as we are able. The New Testament does not require Christians to systematically tithe, nor does it suggest a certain percentage of income to give. As Christians, we should make prayerful consideration in deciding how much to give and allow our giving to be a blessing.

As we enter into our stewardship season, we are looking for 4-5 people who will run our Stewardship campaign. This is a short term 3 month commitment! We want to emphasize the importance of offering time, talent and tithe for the 2016 ministry year! Dear Clerks of Session, Pastors, and Members and Friends of Foothills Presbytery,

After months of careful study and review of the history of operations, the legal issues and the finances of the Buc Outdoor Center (BOC), the Buc Outdoor Center Transitional Board with the approval of Council has come to a determination regarding the operation of Buc Outdoor Center for 2016 and for a ten year plan beyond that.

In past years, the Unified Budget has included a line item for BOC in the amount of \$100,000; however, BOC has operated at a deficit for several years and Presbytery Operating Reserves have been used to cover that deficit in addition to the regular budgeted amount. Most recently in 2014, \$60,700 in Reserve Funds were used for the operating deficit and we project an additional \$51,000+ deficit in 2015 in spite of the best camping attendance in many years and the best cabin rental season ever. Due to the necessity of moving toward a smaller Unified Presbytery Budget and our inability to continue covering operating deficits, we must raise \$220,000 to operate Buc Outdoor Center in 2016. These gifts must be received by October 31, 2015.

Therefore, if you are willing to donate, please send those funds by October 31, 2015. The donated funds will be held in a restricted account. Should the Presbytery receive those funds we will form a Leadership Team to plan for Summer Camp 2016. We encourage churches to donate over and above their commitments to the Unified Giving Budget of Presbytery in order to ensure the continuation of Presbytery's other ministries.

If we do not receive the \$220,000 to operate BOC, we will not have Summer Camp in 2016, cabin and lodge rentals will cease on or about January 15, 2016, and all donations received for the purpose of continuing the Buc Outdoor Center will be returned to the donors.

The Buc Outdoor Center Transitional Board and Council have further concluded that the only viable long-term plan for Buc Outdoor Center is the establishment of a 501(c)(3) eleemosynary entity. In order to form such an entity, to create the necessary permanent Board, to hire the appropriate staff, to deal with long deferred maintenance and improvement, and to have enough money to continue to operate, money needs to be raised to fund a \$3 million Buc Outdoor Center Operating Fund. That amount represents \$300,000 per year for ten years in addition to the \$200,000 per year the Buc Outdoor Center receives in fee revenue to provide an annual operating budget of \$500,000. This amount is required for a safe, quality operation of the facility.



Foothills Presbytery needs to receive actual gifts and certified pledges toward that BOC Operating Fund by July 31, 2016. Again, all funds will be held in a restricted account and if the goal is not met the donations will be returned to the donors. Again, we encourage donations to be over and above commitments to Presbytery's Unified Budget.

The Buc Outdoor Center Transitional Board and Council are quite aware of the difficulty of this situation but as we are called to be good stewards of the gifts God's people freely give, we are confident that these decisions reflect that good stewardship.

We ask that you please make your congregations aware of this request.
