

Pastor's Corner- A Note from Pressley

Dear EPC friends and family-

First, a word of gratitude: so many of you reached out to Ben and me following the recent loss of Ben's 16 year old niece Elizabeth. I am so grateful for the words of condolence through texts, cards and emails. Your prayers gave us comfort and strength in the midst of the pain and darkness of death. Death is never easy, but having just experienced the joy of Easter Sunday, we have been comforted in the promise of the resurrection.

After the celebrations and excitement of Easter Sunday, we often forget that Easter is not a day, but a season. The Great Fifty Days between Easter and Pentecost are a time when the church focuses on the practices of resurrection: living into the hope of new life that Easter offers us as individuals and as a Christian community seeking to share God's love and grace with the world.

I was recently reminded of the words of a hymn that I remember singing every Easter growing up in the United Methodist Church entitled "Easter People". The triumph of the Resurrection over death and evil is the theme of "Easter People." In stanza two, the poet reminds us that the "fear of death" cannot stop us from doing all we can to overcome evil "here below." The final stanza insists: "Every day to [Christians] is Easter" because our God is one who "rights the wrong." May we live every day as Easter People!




Children's Ministry News


