

Dear Eastminster Friends and Family,

I've recently been reading "The Book of Joy: Lasting Happiness in a Changing World"" by the Dalai Lama and Archbishop Tutu. It's a wonderful book by two friends about finding joy and happiness in the face of suffering and grief. Throughout, they include stories, wisdom, and science. Finally, they share their daily Joy Practices that anchor their own emotional and spiritual lives.

One of my favorite quotes reads,

"The more we turn toward others, the more joy we experience, and the more joy we experience, the more we can bring joy to others. The goal is not just to create joy for ourselves but to be a reservoir of joy, an oasis of peace, a pool of serenity that can ripple out to all those around you. Joy is in fact quite contagious. As is love, compassion, and generosity."

I think this quote reflects who we are as a community of faith. The joy that one feels when they walk into Eastminster is contagious. It flows into a sense of welcome that cannot be taught, but is genuine, honest and real. Eastminster also models love, compassion, and generosity throughout every ministry and interaction. April and May 2019 Worship



The narrative lectionary respects the traditional Christian church year, with its principal seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter, and Pentecost. It also respects the rhythms of the school year. These same texts will be used in Children and Middle School Sunday School classes.

April 7
"When Did we See You?"
Matthew 25:31-46

Jesus ends his final discourse to his disciples with the Judgement of the Sheep and the Goats. When the Son of Man returns, all believers will be separated like sheep from goats based upon their service to the king when the king was in need.

April 14
"Triumphal Entry"
Matthew 21:1-17

Jesus enters Jerusalem in a way that fulfills prophetic expectations of the coming Messiah, riding humbly on a donkey.

April 21
"The Empty Tomb"
Matthew 28:1-10

The women find Jesus' tomb empty after an angel rolls away the stone and sits on it. The angel tells them not to fear for Jesus is risen. As they run from the tomb they meet Jesus himself and worship him.

April 28
"The Great Commission"
Matthew 28:16-20

The resurrected Jesus appears to the remaining eleven disciples in Galilee. He commissions them to baptize and make disciples who will follow his teachings. The Gospel ends with Jesus' promise to be with the church until the end of time.

May 5
"Peter's Vision"
Acts 10:1-17, 34-48

Cornelius and Peter both experience visions that lead to their conversion. Both men gain a broader understanding of what God is up to in the world.

May 12
"Paul and Barnabas"
Acts 13:1-3; 14:8-18

Paul and Barnabas take center stage in the narrative as they are sent by the Holy Spirit and the church to carry the gospel to Gentiles across the Roman world.

May 19
"Called to be Saints"
Romans 1:1-17

Paul greets the Roman congregation, and outlines the basic themes to follow, including the relationship between Gentile and Jewish Christians, the role of faith, grace, and obedience, and the righteousness of God.

May 26
"Peace and Hope"
Romans [3:28-30] 5:1-11

God's love for humanity has been shown in the death of Christ, who died for us even though we had done nothing to deserve it. This love that God has shown us gives us the courage and strength to face the sufferings of the world around us.

During the February session meeting, elders reviewed a proposal from our Congregational Care team to begin a Stephen Ministry team. The session was in agreement that Eastminster would benefit from this ministry, but it is a huge financial commitment. There is a one-time fee per church, through the life of the church, that includes the training of those present, books and resources, and Eastminister Presbyterian Church being registered as part of the Stephen Ministry program. Other fees include training for 2-4 "Stephen Leaders", training materials for "Stephen Ministers", and ongoing expenses. Projected costs would be \$6000 to begin this ministry. What is Stephen Ministry?

"Bear one another's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ" (Galatians 6:2, NRSV).

Stephen Ministry is the one-to-one lay caring ministry that takes place in congregations that use the Stephen Series system. Stephen Ministry congregations equip and empower lay caregivers—called Stephen Ministers—to provide high-quality, confidential, Christ-centered care to people who are hurting. The best way to understand how Stephen Ministry works is to learn about three groups of people involved in this ministry: Stephen Leaders, Stephen Ministers, and care receivers.

Stephen Leaders—Direct the overall ministry in the congregation. Stephen Leaders establish and direct Stephen Ministry in a congregation. They—build awareness of Stephen Ministry within the congregation and community recruit and train Stephen Ministers


meet with potential care receivers to assess their needs

match care receivers with Stephen Ministers

provide Stephen Ministers with ongoing supervision and continuing education

Stephen Ministers—Lay caregivers trained in the congregation by Stephen Leaders. Stephen Ministers are congregation members trained by Stephen Leaders to offer high-quality, one-to-one Christian care to people going through tough times.

Care Receivers—People going through tough times who are being cared for by Stephen Ministers. They are—congregation members and others in the community—who receive care from a Stephen Minister. These are people struggling through a difficult time in life—experiencing grief, divorce, job loss, chronic or terminal illness, or some other life crisis. The relationship between a care receiver and a Stephen Minister is confidential. When a care receiver's needs exceed what a Stephen Minister can provide, the Stephen Ministry team makes a referral to an appropriate mental health professional or other community resource.



Children's Sunday School

All children <u>preK-4th</u> have Sunday School upstairs. The children will continue to explore the scriptures of the Narrative Lectionary. <u>All PreK-4th grade children will be walked to the steps of the Sanctuary following the education hour and can be picked up there by a <u>parent/grandparent</u>.</u>

Youth Sunday School

Beginning in January, our <u>5th graders</u> will join the Middle School Class to become the <u>5th-7th</u> <u>Grade Class</u>. This class will follow the narrative lectionary and explore scripture after they have heard it during the summer. The <u>8th-12th Grade Class</u>- will engage in participant led questions and conversations. Join us upstairs for fantastic discussions!

Adult Sunday School

All adults are invited to join us for a special Lenten study on April 7. The study will be lead by Dr. David Rutledge, retired Furman professor.

On April 14, Diane Hughs will lead us into Holy Week with a special emphasis on prayer.

After a break for Easter Sunday, the adult classes will resume on Sunday, April 28. More information will be available.






The Art of Fellowship
