May 5 "Peter's Vision" Acts 10:1-17, 34-48

Cornelius and Peter experience visions that lead to their conversion. Both men gain a broader understanding of what God is doing in the world.

May 12 "Paul and Barnabas" Acts 13:1-3; 14:8-18

Paul and Barnabas take center stage in the narrative as they are sent by the Holy Spirit and the church to carry the gospel across the world.

> May 19 "Called to be Saints" Romans 1:1-17

Paul greets the Roman congregation, and outlines the basic themes to follow, including the relationship between Gentile and Jewish Christians, the role of faith, grace, and obedience, and the righteousness of God.

Dear Eastminster Friends and Family,

I spent the week of April 22 at as a Thompson Scholar at Columbia Theological Seminary in Decatur, Georgia. The Thompson scholar program brings together pastors and other church leaders every year to focus on an area of evangelism. This year's topic was "Tell Me Your Story And I'll Know Why I Should Come To Your Church". The seminar focused on the power of telling the story of your congregation through video, still images, and social media.

I came away with many thoughts and ideas about how to enhancing Eastminster's presence on the internet from live streaming worship to capturing all that we do through pictures and video. As part of the ministry of Compassionate Hospitality, we have developed a session team, Communications and Evangelism, that will focus on these areas to help Eastminster share its story so people know who we are and why it's exciting to be a part of the ministry here. During the February session meeting, elders reviewed a proposal from our Congregational Care team to begin a Stephen Ministry team. The session was in agreement that Eastminster would benefit from this ministry, but it is a huge financial commitment. There is a one-time fee per church to be registered as part of the Stephen Ministry and to have access to training, books, and resources. Other fees include training for 3-4 "Stephen Leaders", training materials for "Stephen Ministers", and ongoing expenses. Projected costs would be \$6000 to begin this ministry. What is Stephen Ministry?

"Bear one another's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ" (Galatians 6:2, NRSV).

Stephen Ministry is the one-to-one lay caring ministry that takes place in congregations that use the Stephen Series system. Stephen Ministry congregations equip and empower lay caregivers—called Stephen Ministers—to provide high-quality, confidential, Christ-centered care to people who are hurting. The best way to understand how Stephen Ministry works is to learn about three groups of people involved in this ministry: Stephen Leaders, Stephen Ministers, and care receivers.

Stephen Leaders—Direct the overall ministry in the congregation. Stephen Leaders establish and direct Stephen Ministry in a congregation. They build awareness of Stephen Ministry within the congregation and community recruit and train Stephen Ministers meet with potential care receivers to assess their needs match care receivers with Stephen Ministers provide Stephen Ministers with ongoing supervision and continuing education

Stephen Ministers—Lay caregivers trained in the congregation by Stephen Leaders. Stephen Ministers are congregation members trained by Stephen Leaders to offer highquality, one-to-one Christian care to people going through tough times.

Care Receivers—People going through tough times who are being cared for by Stephen Ministers. They are—congregation members and others in the community—who receive care from a Stephen Minister. These are people struggling through a difficult time in life experiencing grief, divorce, job loss, chronic or terminal illness, or some other life crisis. The relationship between a care receiver and a Stephen Minister is confidential. When a care receiver's needs exceed what a Stephen Minister can provide, the Stephen Ministry team makes a referral to an appropriate mental health professional or other community resource.

Women's Circle


