The narrative lectionary respects the traditional seasons of the Christian church year-Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter, and Pentecost. It also respects the rhythms of the school year. Beginning in January, we will explore the gospel of Mark . These same texts will be used in Preschool, Elementary, and Middle School Sunday School classes.

#### December 22

"Repeat the Sounding Joy: Loving Joy" Luke 1:5-25, 57-80 An angel came to the priest Zechariah and promised that he and his wife Elizabeth will soon have a son. Zechariah propesied that his son would become a prophet. The son would grow up to be John the Baptist.

#### **Tuesday, December 24**

"The Lord is Come: Incarnate Joy" Luke 2:1-20 The promised Messiah is born in Bethlehem. Angels appear in the sky to announce this good news to shepherds. The shepherds then find the infant Jesus. They go out and announce the good news to others!

#### **December 29**

"Wonders of His Love: Compassionate Joy" Join us for a special worship service telling of the birth and early life of Jesus through word and hymns.

#### January 5

"Jesus Heals Many" Mark 1:21-45 Jesus brings God's kingdom to earth through his words and deeds as he teaches with authority and heals the sick.

#### January 12

"Baptism of the Lord" Mark 1:1-20 John the Baptist preaches at the Jordan River, calling on people to repent and be baptized.

#### January 19

"God's Kingdom Announced" Mark 4:1-34 Jesus preaches to large crowds about the kingfom of God using parables while explaining everything in private t o his disciples.

#### January 26

"The Power of the Kingdom" Mark 5:1-20 Jesus meets a man who is possessed by demons and casts t hem out into a herd of pigs. Jesus tells the grateful man to share his experience of God's mercy with his friends and family.

and is currently living with them while she finds her next opportunity.



Brenda and Mark both love to sing and have joined the EPC Choir and expect to lend joyful noise to church services.


